### **Living the Gospel**

Romans 1:14-17 I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. <sup>15</sup> So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome. <sup>16</sup> For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. <sup>17</sup> For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

#### Intro

- > These are very challenging verses...
  - These are verses, that when we read them... we should walk away asking for God's help
  - We should be praying... give me this same heart oh God...
    - These are verses that challenge us to walk in a more worthy manner
- ➤ Here we see the heart of a man who was in love with Jesus...
  - And his love for Jesus and his fellow man was compelling and clear for all to see
  - Through the Gospel Paul had found and all encompassing Joy and Satisfaction in God
- **➤** Let Me Pose a Question...
  - How many of you in here consider yourself smart?
  - How many consider yourself not smart enough to understand a book like this?
    - I am not going to tell you that you are smart enough...
      - ♦ Because being smart is not how you understand the Bible
      - ♦ Because only God can open your eyes to understand many of these things...
      - ♦ The Bible is understood spiritually through the help of the Holy Spirit
    - You can absolutely gain a very good understanding
      - Of the doctrines of grace and salvation and justification plus more...
      - ♦ If you set your heart through prayer... in faith and in diligence... to understand
- Please do not enter into this study lightly...
  - Prepare yourself weekly to be met by God in His Word...
  - Let God begin to challenge you and shape your mind...
    - Write notes... Write questions... ask God questions... search for answers... know God Better
- > That is my intro... now for a little background

### Background

- Paul the apostle writes this book to a church in Rome...
  - It is likely that this church had a large gentile section...
  - So... I say... in that way they are much like us...
- > Paul is writing to a church where many of the members were not Jewish...
  - Although there were plenty of Jewish members...
  - We know this because Paul spends a lot of time, it seems... trying to unite the two groups...
- > There was a difference b/w the two...
  - **The Jewish people** grew up under the commands of the Mosaic Law...
    - And they felt compelled to keep as many of them as they could...
    - And they felt like the other members of the church should do the same thing
  - **The Gentile** people grew up with no strings attaching them to the mosaic law...
    - So, they were free in almost every aspect from the law of Moses...
    - And this is a huge divide...
- > There, is no need to go deep into the divide between the two...
  - But, knowing that will help understand why Paul argues certain points
    - Therefore... you understand better what is going on

### **One Overarching Idea in the Book of Romans**

- It is about the Gospel of God, For the Glory of God
  - This book is about God...
  - **The gospel**, which is the good news concerning Jesus coming, death and resurrection...
    - Which in turn makes it so that men can follow Jesus and attain eternal life...
    - The Gospel is how God is glorified...

# ➤ God's Glory is The most important thing we could see:

- God's Glory coming first, is the key to unlocking good toward men...
- It is to God's glory that we are offered mercy and grace to come to God...
- So, What is this book about?
  - God being Glorified in the Gospel

### **\*** What Are Some Things We Will Learn

- ➤ In this book He is going to explain clearly what salvation is...
  - How salvation can be attained...
  - How it was made possible...
- > Paul is going to explain what righteousness is...
  - And how we can have it
- ➤ He will explain the importance of Faith...
  - And it's link to Grace...
- Paul explains what Grace is...
  - and how it is possible for us to attain the Grace of God...
- > All this and much much more...
  - The Book of Romans is unlike any book in the new testament...
    - It offers so much to us in understanding how God has worked in us
    - And it offers such a behind the scene look as to why God worked the way that he did
- > It is such an amazing book, that you would do well...
  - If you took your time and read it over and over and over again...
- That is a little bitty bit of background for you... Let's lay a foundation before getting to the verses

### ❖ A Little Ground Work First

- ➤ What is the Gospel... and What is Salvation...
  - Before giving you a definition of both...
  - Let me ask you a question...

## Our First Big Question of the Day: What is man's greatest danger?

- What is it that man rightly worries about the most
- What is it that should keep people up at night the most...
  - When I was growing up I never had any nightmares...
    - I think I kind of had one... but it was fun all the way through until the end
      - ➤ When I got shot in the back...
      - And woke up to a picture having fallen off the wall onto my back...
  - But... I had friends that had nightmares...
    - ♦ And they were afraid of Freddie kruger, or Jason... or spiders or snakes... or whatever...
    - ♦ And it would keep them up at night worrying...
      - Maybe you have fears about how it feels to die... or cancer, or a heart attack...
        - Or a terrorist attack... or the dentist...
      - ➤ All of these things pail in comparison to our greatest danger...
- Maybe you would say...
  - Our greatest danger is Satan... and how following him leads to death...

- Oh yeah... Death... that is our greatest danger... or Sin...
  - ♦ Can I change my answer to sin? Sin is the greatest danger...
- Wrong on all accounts....
- Our greatest Danger is the Glorious, Almighty and All Holy God...
  - ♦ Moses says in Deut 4.24 "the Lord your God is a consuming Fire, a jealous God"
- Our Greatest Danger is the Wrath of God...
  - Of all things we ought to fear... it ought to be the God of all creation
  - That should keep people up at night...
- Everyone considers God to be their friend...
  - And that He would never do anything to hurt someone
  - He would always forgive and be kind...
  - But do not mistake God's kindness with weakness...
    - ♦ Or make Him out to be someone who can be trifled with...
      - Trifle means treating Him insignigicantly...
  - **God's kindness** isn't a license to be or do whatever... it has a another purpose all together
    - ◆ Romans 2:4 "Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?"
  - Because: Our Next set of verses
    - Romans 1:18 The wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men...
      - ➤ And... all men have sinned...
      - > And all men are unrighteous...
- The Greatest Worry for Men should be...
  - The wrath of Almighty God... for it is God you must contend with when you leave this earth
    - ♦ It is God you must answer to...
  - So many people think it is the devil or demons that we need to be worried about...
    - ♦ And I am not saying that is without warrant...
    - ♦ But it is clear as day... God ought to be feared FIRST and Foremost...
    - ◆ Jesus himself said, "Do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul; but rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell." Matt 10:28

#### **❖** What is Salvation

- Let's put it plainly ok...
  - It is not just that we are saved from eternal death... although we are...
  - It is not just that we are saved from sin... although we are...
- Our Salvation is being Saved from the wrath of God...
  - Do you hear that this morning... please hear and understand...
  - That if you sit here today untouched in your heart by the Holy Spirit...
    - If you sit here having never repented of your sins and trusting in Jesus...
    - You sit under the wrath of God upon your pitiful soul...
- Salvation is Salvation because it saves us from God!...
  - You wonder... am I wrong? Am I crazy? Is this blasphemous... It is not!
  - Read your Bible...!
- ➤ What is Salvation?... again... Being saved from the wrath of God...
  - Why are all men at some point deserving of the wrath of God...
  - Paul will answer that in
    - Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God,

#### **❖** What is the Gospel?

The Gospel comes to us in our most desperate Condition...

- Standing in the truth of Romans 3:23 for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God
- Standing in the truth of Romans 6:23 for the wages of sin is death...
  - And this is not just dying... there is a second death coming...
    - ♦ Where all unbelieving people will find themselves cast into a lake of fire...
    - ♦ To be consumed by the wrath of God throughout eternity...
    - ♦ This is where the gospel meets us...
- > The Gospel offers us Mercy... it offers us grace...
- ➤ The Gospel tells the story of Jesus...
  - The Gospel explains to us that Jesus is God the Son of God
  - And that He came into this World to save sinners... he lived a perfect life...
  - And Jesus died on the cross... and He bore the punishment for our sins in His body
  - Jesus took the wrath of God for sinful man...
  - Then He Rose from the grave and eventually ascended into heaven
- > The Gospel tells us that God will give the righteous nature of Jesus
  - To everyone who trusts in the Person and Work of Jesus...
- ➤ The Gospel though... is not just saving us from the wrath of God...
  - It is not just giving us heaven... because what if heaven is no fun?
  - It is not just removing our sins from us and forgiving us...
  - The Gospel is not just making people right with God...
- > The Gospel offers so much more...
  - Because the Gospel offers us the greatest of all joys... it does not just save us from punishment
  - It replaces that with unending satisfaction and Joy in the God of the universe...
    - Repeat... write that down
  - Now... that is for you to mature in... For you to grow in...
    - Is the gospel working in you to create joy in you knowing of Jesus more and more...
- Ok... Now that we have laid a little groundwork... and taking up almost all our time...
  - Let's dig into these verses this morning...

# **❖** Point #1: Obligation To Preach the Gospel

- I am under obligation both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish.
- > Paul says he has a debt... that is what he means by obligation here...
  - He is in debt to... essentially all men here...
  - And from the following verses... you will see His debt is that He must preach the gospel...
  - He has an obligation to Preach the Gospel...
    - Preach means... To tell the good news... to bring the good news...
      - ♦ It doesn't mean to stand behind a pulpit or with a megaphone...
- Our Second Big Question of the Day:
  - Why is Paul Obligated to Preach the Gospel... and are We in Debt to preach the Gospel as Well?
- **Paul** is in debt to Preach the Gospel Because:
  - Look back at verse 5... "We have received grace"
    - Now... notice... it is not God that He is indebted to... although it is God through Christ Jesus
      - ♦ Who had given him grace...
        - The Debt: It is to the greeks and barbarians and wise and foolish
    - Also... He is not in debt to God for the grace because then it would not be grace...
      - ♦ Grace by definition means that you did not earn it... it was freely given...
      - ♦ Let me give you a verse to prove that...
        - Romans 4.4 <sup>4</sup> Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. <sup>5</sup> And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness,
          - So understand... His debt to preach the gospel is not to God in this sense

- I am not saying Paul thinks we have not been in debt to God...
  - We were... because of our purposeful rebellion...
  - Which is why we needed the grace... right?
- I am also not saying that Paul Doesn't think He ought to tell the gospel to others
  - because of what Jesus has done for us.
  - Because He ought to... he should feel compelled to do this...
- But here in this verse... that is not what is going on... Rather...
  - Paul feels like He owes it to the rest of mankind...
  - Since he has received free grace... salvation from the wrath of God... and joy in Christ
  - He says... who am I to withhold it from anyone...
  - Illustration:
    - ♦ The other night here at this church...
      - ➤ Joanne came in with some chocolate covered Macadamia Nuts...
      - And she gave me a whole pack... which Lia promptly stole from me
      - Then she gave it back after taking a few...
      - But then I heard that Marise wanted some...
      - And there were a few left... And they were given to me...
      - > so they were now my chocolate
    - ♦ But, I felt compelled to share with Marise more than she even asked for...
      - Why... I said... because I had been given it freely... Joanne had asked for nothing
      - And she graciously gave me a whole pack of yummy goodness
    - ♦ Now... what kind of person would I have been...
      - If I kept the whole pack to myself when I knew that Marise wanted a few
        - She didn't take them from me like lia... who apparently didn't trust me to share
        - What if I had said... they are mine... I deserve them and not you
        - Joanne chose me because I am nice to her... because I have a beard
        - Because I have been a better friend to her
        - I follow the rules better
        - Because I am this or that...
      - > I would have been Selfish and extremely vain...
        - Also... I think I would have lacked an understanding of a free gift
        - I wouldn't have understood grace...
- Paul Understood grace...
  - So He wanted to share how God had taken away His sins...
    - ♦ How God had given Him a righteousness that was not His own...
    - ♦ And this was only through Faith...
  - He wanted to share that with the people around him...
    - ♦ He felt obligated to do this...
    - ♦ No matter who they were...
      - because He considered himself on level ground with them all
- ➤ Are We too in debt to preach the gospel...? A Resounding Yes!...
  - Have we not received the same gospel
  - Have we not received the same grace
  - Have we not received the same righteousness from Jesus that was not our own...
    - If indeed we have...
  - Therefore... We too are obligated to tell the gospel to all people...
    - How are we doing?

### ❖ Point #2: Eagerness to Preach the Gospel

• 15 So I am eager to preach the gospel to you also who are in Rome.

- Not Only was Paul obligated to tell the gospel...
  - He was also Eager...
    - Eager meaning... he was willing and ready and had a desire to do this...
- **Before we go too much further...** 
  - I want you to understand that Paul is not only referring to Evangelism...
    - ♦ Just explaining the gospel to the unbeliever
    - ♦ Which I do believe He has that in mind...
    - But it seems from the text he also wants to encourage believers with the gospel...
      - ♦ And this will become more and more clear as we continue...
  - But, look back for a moment... He wants to come preach the gospel to them...
    - And He is speaking to many believers here in this church in this letter...
    - And back in verses 11 and 12 he says he wants to **encourage** them
    - and be **encouraged by** them... and he wants to **strengthen** them...
  - And the reason he wants to tell the gospel... explain it... expound on it ... to believers...
    - Is because they must continue in the gospel if they want to be saved...
    - They must continue believing... so it is important that he come and encourage them...
      - ♦ More on that point next week...
- **→** Here in lies one of the reasons he was eager...
  - Not only was he excited to see people believe the gospel...
  - He was also excited to see people continue in the gospel and be strengthened in the gospel
  - There is a principal here you must learn: Write it down...
    - You should be prepared to encourage your fellow believers in the gospel...
    - You should be prepared to strengthen others with the gospel
- > This begins to lead us to the main reason He was eager to preach the gospel...
  - Look forward to verse 16 He says... I am eager to preach to you in Rome
    - 16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes,
    - If you look in that verse... you see Paul **believes** something about the gospel
      - ♦ More than that... he **knows** something about the gospel
      - ♦ It is the **power** of the God for salvation to everyone who believes...
  - It is the Power of the Gospel that feeds Paul's eagerness to preach
    - To preach to unbelievers... but also to believers
- ➤ Big Question #3: Why aren't we more eager? What can help create a stronger desire in us to tell the gospel...?
  - Maybe we need a fresh and intimate experience with the Power of God for salvation...
  - And what I mean by that is this:
    - One: We need to recognize our sins before a Holy God and come to Him for the first time
    - Or Two: We need to live daily shaped by the truths of the gospel...
      - Meaning we meditate on it, read about it, and live it... then see how God shapes us
- ➤ We See Paul is Eager to tell the gospel... And We should be the same way...
  - But we need to be shaped by it...
- Now... Let's look at Paul's attitude about the Gospel...

## **❖** Point #3: Unashamed to Preach the Gospel

- 16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel,
- ➤ What does it mean to be ashamed? And are you Ashamed?
  - To be ashamed means you are embarrassed
  - Illustration:
    - When I was growing up...
      - my dad did not believe in spending a lot of money on shoes and clothes...

- ♦ Therefore... I always got my shoes from payless
- ♦ And I hated it... I hated it, not because they were not fine shoes...
- Because when I went to school... all my other classmates wore name brand shoes...
  - ♦ I do not know how they could afford it, but they had them...
  - ♦ And they would make fun of me for my cheaper shoes...
  - ♦ So I would try to walk so they couldn't see them...
  - Or keep my feet under my desk so they didn't stand out...
    - I am serious... telling the truth... shoes were a big deal....
- I was embarrassed because I was not proud of my shoes...
  - ♦ I did not like them... because they were of little value...
- Now... there was this one time I got some hand me down Air Jordans from my cousin
  - ♦ And they were Red... They looked something like this... (show picture)
  - ♦ To my dad, they were the most hideous thing he had ever seen...
  - ♦ He wore boots everyday... As a matter of fact... I do not think I even saw him in a pair of sneakers till I was like 15...
    - > So he didn't like them...
  - ♦ But to me... they had the sweet fragrance of coolness to them...
    - > Even though they were used...
- I loved those shoes...
  - ♦ Why? I knew their value... and I also knew my classmates... who obsessed over shoes...
    - Would think they were cool...
  - I wore those shoes... literally until they almost fell off my feet
    - And I showed them off... and I stuck my feet out in the aisle for others to see
  - ♦ I was not ashamed of the Air Jordans... I knew their value...
    - ➤ It did not matter to me what my dad thought about those shoes...

### > Paul was Unashamed of the Gospel...

- The Gospel had saved him
- The gospel had transformed his life
- The gospel was continuing to save him and continuing to transform his life...
- An Aside... Let's Separate the gospel from past church experiences...
  - Or legalism... or health and wealth ism
  - Or hatreds and racisms etc... These things make us ashamed of "church" sometimes
  - The gospel of God is not what some people in the church have twisted it to be...
  - Do not make the mistake of being frustrated with following God over man's sin in the church

# > Now... what drove Paul to being so Unashamed of the Gospel?

- Because you can look at his life... He did not care what anyone said...
- He was going to preach the gospel...
- They could beat him, whip him, torture him, stone him, arrest him, steal from him, lie to him, leave him, shipwreck him, starve him...
- They could shame him every day...
  - But He would never be ashamed of that gospel he held on to so dearly all his days...
  - Because Jesus had given the murderous Paul undeserved Grace!

## #4 Big Question: Are you ashamed of the gospel? If so, Why?

- You really need to ask that question
- Do you not see the value of Jesus?
  - Do you not remember what He has done for you?
  - Do you not remember from where you have come?... who you were?... what you did?
  - Have you ever even experienced the salvation that comes from the gospel...
- For many of us, We have wondered away from the warmth of God's promises in the gospel.
  - Therefore we need to get real close and spend some extra time there

- We need to remember what God has done for us... and let that feed our life...
- This is Explained greatly for us by Luke in Luke 7 (I love this snippet from Jesus' life)
  - The scene is Jesus has come to the house of a Pharisee
  - And there was a woman who heard that He was there...
  - And in the text luke says, "there was a woman in the city who was a sinner"
    - ♦ Now... we assume show must have been pretty bad to have that label in town...
  - But she came to the dinner with a perfume bottle...
    - ♦ And she poured it all over Jesus feet, and she wept over them and wiped his feet with her tears...
    - ♦ And she was kissing his feet...
    - When the Pharisee saw this, it seemed as if he were appalled that Jesus would allow it
  - So Jesus spoke to the Pharisee
  - Luke 7:40-48 <sup>40</sup> And Jesus answering said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." And he answered, "Say it, Teacher." <sup>41</sup> "A certain moneylender had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. <sup>42</sup> When they could not pay, he cancelled the debt of both. Now which of them will love him more?" <sup>43</sup> Simon answered, "The one, I suppose, for whom he cancelled the larger debt." And he said to him, "You have judged rightly." <sup>44</sup> Then turning toward the woman he said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave me no water for my feet, but she has wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. <sup>45</sup> You gave me no kiss, but from the time I came in she has not ceased to kiss my feet. <sup>46</sup> You did not anoint my head with oil, but she has anointed my feet with ointment. <sup>47</sup> Therefore I tell you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven—for she loved much. But he who is forgiven little, loves little." <sup>48</sup> And he said to her, "Your sins are forgiven."

# > Also in Luke we see Jesus healing ten lepers

- Luke 17:11-18 On the way to Jerusalem he was passing along between Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup> And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance <sup>13</sup> and lifted up their voices, saying, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us." <sup>14</sup> When he saw them he said to them, "Go and show yourselves to the priests." And as they went they were cleansed. <sup>15</sup> Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; <sup>16</sup> and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. <sup>17</sup> Then Jesus answered, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? <sup>18</sup> Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup> And he said to him, "Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well."
  - Notice here... Jesus was gracious to all of them... but only one came back to thank Him...
    - ♦ Do you see the avenue of His healing... it was his faith... in Christ...
    - ♦ Which we will see next week...
      - Faith is the avenue to receiving and accessing the grace the gospel offers
- ➤ Who are you? Who am I?
  - Once you answer that honestly... you can then move forward...
  - And begin to look at the depth and the wonders of the gospel of Jesus
- And... this moves us to where we will pick up next week...
  - And this is why Paul had such unwavering confidence and unashamedness in the gospel
  - There was power in the gopel
